

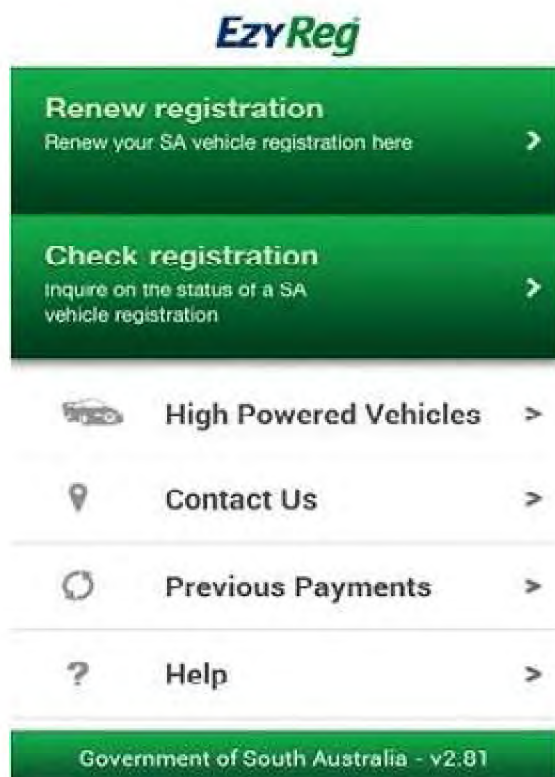

## High Powered Vehicle check



A new High Powered Vehicle (HPV) check will help provisional licence drivers find out if a vehicle manufactured in 2010 or later is defined as an HPV vehicle. On 1 March 2014, the definition changed for vehicles manufactured from 1 January 2010 onwards.

Did you know that the EzyReg mobile app now includes HPV status check for Android devices?

- Download the EzyReg app on an Android mobile device from the Android app store.
- Select High Powered Vehicles from the EzyReg app main menu.
- Enter the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) or, for SA vehicles, the registration number.
- EzyReg app will display vehicle registration information and HPV status.

- On roads where there are lanes marked on the road, if your lane comes to an end, you must give way to traffic already in the lane you are moving into.
- On roads where there are no lanes marked on the road, when lines of traffic merge, you must give way to any vehicle that is ahead of you.
